








Floor Plan

his demographic analysis of Hollywood examines two geographies within the greater Hollywood area: the HED and the Hollywood Trade Area (the Hollywood neighborhood and Hollywood Hills). The Hollywood Trade Area roughly includes the area within a two-mile radius of Hollywood & Highland.



























Ownervs. Renter-Occupied Units


